



EMERGENCY HOUSING ASSISTANCE (EHAP) PROGRAM

Proposal:

Amend City's ordinance and requirement under the EHAP program to increasing the beneficiary's current income limit from fifty percent (50%) Area Median Income (AMI) to eighty percent (80%) AMI level to assist more homes in need of emergency repair. HUD guidelines allow 80% AMI.





EHAP Income Requirement

EHAP Summary



- Since the inception of the EHAP program in 1984, the income limit has been restricted to a maximum AMI of 50%.
- HUD allows up to 80% AMI
- In 2012, we saw a reduction in the 311 intake list of eligible applicants and an increase of 45% in over-income applicants.
- The economy's financial state and tragic weather elements left homeowners of various income levels in a state of emergency restoration.
- With this change the department seeks to help more Seniors and working families.
