

## RESOLUTION

"Call for Hearings to Discuss Local Protections to Ensure Due Process"

**WHEREAS**, the First, Fifth, and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution protect the rights to free speech and due process of law, which are fundamental to a functioning democracy and to the civil liberties of all Chicagoans, regardless of immigration status or political beliefs; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Chicago is committed to protecting free expression and civil liberties, providing sanctuary for vulnerable populations, and standing in opposition to censorship, political intimidation, and the suppression of dissent; and

**WHEREAS**, the Trump administration has demonstrated a fierce commitment to organizing authoritarian powers for President Trump by challenging our nation's system of checks and balances; and

**WHEREAS**, the Trump administration has inspired a mass movement that seeks to repress individual liberties, self expression, and democracy by targeting vulnerable populations such as immigrants, refugees, the transgender community, and poor people, to name a few; and

WHEREAS, leaders of organizations and campaigns that challenge the political and administrative goals of the Trump administration have been regularly kidnapped and imprisoned without due process; and

**WHEREAS**, federal agencies have been deputized to engage in a mass deportation campaign across the United States in which many Chicagoans have been taken from their homes, workplaces, and public places without due process, causing irreparable harm to these individuals, their families, and our communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chicago City Council has a responsibility to investigate and understand the extent to which local residents may have been or may be targeted or affected, and to reaffirm its commitment to protecting civil liberties; now, therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that we, the Mayor and the members of the Chicago City Council, do hereby call on the Committee on Health and Human Relations to examine recent alleged violations of free speech and due process rights, discuss ways that the City can safeguard the rights of our residents, and to bring to light existing protections; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that we call on the Chair of the committee to invite affected individuals, civil liberties organizations, the Law Department, and any other applicable organizations, or departments to attend such hearing and assist in producing recommendations for how the City can best protect residents from political retaliation and governmental overreach in the future.
