

ORDER

WHEREAS, the Chicago Municipal Code Chapter 2-173 declares that no person employed or acting on behalf of a City of Chicago department, agency, division, commission, council, committee, board, other body, or person established by authority of an ordinance, executive order, or City Council order shall expend their time responding to ICE inquiries or communicating with ICE regarding a person's custody status, release date, or contact information unless it is to determine whether any matter involves enforcement based solely on a violation of a civil immigration law; AND

WHEREAS, that Chapter further declares that an agent shall not set up a traffic perimeter or provide on-site support to assist a civil immigration enforcement operation; THEREFORE

BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO, the Chicago Police Department (CPD), Office of Emergency Management and Communications (OEMC), Mayor's Office and/or any relevant office, department or agency within the City of Chicago shall provide:

1. Any communication—internal and/or external—related to any CPD presence at the Intensive Supervision Appearance Program BI Incorporated Building at 2245 N Michigan Ave and/or any other locations on the 2200 block of N Michigan Ave on June 4, 2025;
2. Any communication—internal and/or external—related to any request from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, its deputized federal agents, and all of its subsidiaries and contractors for local law enforcement presence at the Intensive Supervision Appearance Program BI Incorporated Building at 2245 N Michigan Ave and/or any other locations in the City of Chicago on June 4, 2025;
3. A list of the notifications with events describing a request for assistance with the enforcement of federal civil immigration law as required under Section 2-173-020(b) on June 4, 2025;
4. With regard to immigration detainees or administrative warrants received by CPD related to enforcement of civil immigration law for June 4, 2025:
 - a. The date that CPD received the immigration detainer or administrative warrant; and
 - b. Whether CPD transferred the individual subject to the immigration detainer or administrative warrant to a federal agency's custody and, if so, which agency; AND

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, such information shall be compiled and provided to City Council upon passage of this Order.
