The amendment impacts Special Service Area No. 59-2022 (59th Street) regarding interim service provider agreement with Greater Southwest Development Corporation and 2026 tax levy. There was a substitute ordinance presented. The substitute ordinance replaced the service provider from Greater Southwest Development Corporation to Back of the Yards Neighborhood Council.

ITEM 26 - TAX INCENTIVES
